MAHESH GROVER, J.

The petitioner prays for appropriate directions to be issued to the respondent to protect him. He alleges a financial transaction between himself and the private respondents and contends in his petition that the private respondents have obtained blank papers and cheques from him which they are intending to abuse. He has also been threatened by them.

On due consideration of the matter, I am of the opinion that the instant petition is totally mis-conceived. In the backdrop of the financial transaction between the petitioner and the private respondents his plea of being threatened by the private respondents by abusing certain documents cannot be accepted and these are the matters to be agitated before the Court of competent jurisdiction in the appropriate proceedings. In the exercise of powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C this Court has no mechanism to enter into the veracity of the allegations of the kind levelled by the petitioner.

Besides, the official respondents have pointed out that the petitioner himself

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is a proclaimed offender.

If that be so then the instant petition deserves to be dismissed on the sole ground of concealment of facts.

Noticing the aforesaid facts in totality, instant petition is dismissed, leaving the petitioner to his remedies in law.
