FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Rajpura dated 11.02.2015, based on the statements made by the parties before the Court, has been received and perused. The Court has shown its satisfaction that the matter has been compromised voluntarily, without any coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of submissions made by petitioners' counsel that the complainant Bakhshish Singh as well as accused Harjit Singh and Jaspal Singh belong to the same very village and in view of the

fact that the offence for which the accused have been arrayed is not of a heinous nature coupled with the satisfaction shown by the Court and that the compromise will go a long way in resolving the personal dispute and to bring about peace and harmony, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.72 dated 08.07.2009 registered at Police Station Banur, District Patiala under Sections 323/324/149 IPC and all consequences arising thereof are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
