AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a petition for anticipatory bail filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. since the petitioners have been summoned to face trial in a Criminal Complaint case bearing No.297-1 of 22.01.2013/17.09.2013 under Section 302 read with Section 120-B and 34 IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that the son of the petitioners was married in the year of 1999 and his wife committed suicide on 25.07.2012. An FIR was lodged which was thoroughly investigated and the cancellation report was submitted. At this stage the Court on cognizance of the private complaint summoned the petitioners who are old

people.

Learned Assistant Advocate General on instructions from ASI Ram Mehar has accepted the aforesaid assertions.

Notice was issued on 24.12.2014 but none has come present on behalf of respondent No.1 despite service. It is stated that the case is now fixed for 06.01.2015 for appearance and the prayer made is that the petitioners may be allowed to appear before the Court and face trial but they be released on bail. In this view of the matter and in view of the fact the none has come present on behalf of respondent No.1, I do not deem it appropriate to deny anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Let the petitioners appear before the trial Court on the date fixed i.e. 06.01.2015 and the trial Court shall release them on bail to its satisfaction.

Petition stands disposed of in the above terms.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
