Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.01 dated 02.01.2015, registered at Police Station Women Sonapat, District Sonapat, under Sections 498-A, 354-D, 509 and 292 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 65 of the Information and Technology Act, 2000.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the

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record.

There are serious allegations against the petitioner of harassment, unnatural acts and rubbing the nose of complainant on the floor and dragging her. Besides this, there is also allegation of causing injury on the ear of complainant. Although, the complainant has been got examined from a private hospital, it is not required to go into its evidentiary value at this stage. Otherwise also, recovery of various dowry articles and ornaments are yet to be effected. It is pertinent to mention here that being matrimonial dispute, interim relief was granted to the petitioner for exploring the possibility of compromise, but mediation has failed.

In view of above, no ground for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out.

Dismissed.

It goes without saying that interim order dated 12.02.2015 stands vacated.
