AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a petition for anticipatory bail filed in case bearing FIR No. 78 dated 12.12.2014, under Sections 323, 324, 34 IPC(Section 326 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Kathgarh, Distt. SBS Nagar.

As regards petitioners No. 1 and 2, the allegations are that they gave *danda* blows on the back and left leg of the complainant respectively. Both the injuries are simple in nature and on non-vital parts of the body. Learned AAG has accepted these factual assertions.

In the circumstances I do not deem it appropriate to deny the concession of anticipatory bail to petitioners No. 1 and 2. Let them appear before the investigating officer on 05.03.2015 between 10.00 a.m.to 4.00 p.m. On their appearance the investigating officer shall release them on anticipatory bail to his satisfaction subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has stated that he does not wish to press the petition for anticipatory bail on behalf of petitioner No.3 but liberty may be granted to him to surrender before the trial Court on the date fixed viz. 02.03.2015 and move an application for regular bail and that a direction be also issued to the Court to decide the said application expeditiously.

I find this to be a fair request.

Allowed as prayed for.

Let petitioner No.3 surrender before the trial Court on 02.03.2015 and move an application for regular bail which shall be decided by the Court expeditiously but in any case on or before 04.03.2015.

Petition stands disposed of in the above terms.

Since the main case has been decided, the Criminal Misc.Application, if any also stands disposed of.
