REKHA MITTAL, J.

The petitioner has filed the instant petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (in short "Cr.P.C.") for issuance of directions to respondents No. 2 and 3 to provide security to the petitioner as her life and liberty is at immense danger at the behest of respondents No. 4 to 6.

A reading of averments set up in the petition gives a clue that jurisdiction of the court has been invoked with some ulterior purpose to be satisfied.

In this view of the matter, I do not think it to be a fit case wherein intervention in exercise of extraordinary jurisdiction under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is warranted.
