RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Petitioner, by way of instant petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure ('Cr.P.C.' for short), seeks protection to his life and liberty from the hands of respondent No.5.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, reply was filed on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 4.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Richhpal Singh, Police Station Khanna and while referring to the averments taken in para 10 of the preliminary submissions in reply, submits that matter was enquired into. No threat perception was found existing, as alleged by the petitioner. He further submits that if the petitioner would have any apprehension from anybody including respondent No.5, he would be at liberty to approach the competent authority and his grievance shall be redressed at the earliest possible time, by taking suitable action on his representation.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also

fairly states that let the present petition may be disposed of, in view of the statement made by the learned counsel for the Stage, but liberty may be granted to the petitioner to approach the competent authority, as and when necessity arises.

In view of the above, the instant petition is disposed of, however, with liberty as prayed for.
