This order shall dispose of aforesaid two petitions i.e CRM No. M-621 of 2015 filed by Kuldip Singh and CRM No. M-577 of 2015 filed by Veena Rani & others.

CRM No. M-621 of 2015 has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.206 dated 17.11.2014 under Sections 323, 452, 336, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25, 27, 54 and 59 of Arms Act, registered at Police Station South Moga, District Moga, on the basis of compromise, along with all subsequent proceedings arising from that FIR.

CRM No. M-577 of 2015 has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of cross-version recorded as Rapat No. 14 dated 17.11.2014 in FIR No.206 dated 17.11.2014 under Sections 323, 452, 336, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25, 27, 54 and 59 of Arms Act, registered at Police Station South Moga, District Moga, on the basis of

compromise along with all subsequent proceedings arising from that FIR.

Report of learned trial Court has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that compromise has been effected between the parties with the intervention of respectables, which is outcome of free-will. Even otherwise, the matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

It is pretty settled that compromise is the soul of justice, which not only enhances the social amity, harmony and peace but also reduces friction and discord.

In view of the above I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

Consequently, both the petitions are allowed and FIR No.206 dated 17.11.2014 under Sections 323, 452, 336, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25, 27, 54 and 59 of Arms Act, registered at Police Station South Moga, District Moga and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom including cross-version recorded as Rapat No.14 dated 17.11.2014 are quashed qua the petitioner(s).
