MAHESH GROVER, J.

The petitioner prays for grant of pre-arrest bail in terms of Section 438 Cr.P.C in case FIR no. 97 dated 10.9.2014 registered under Sections 420, 384, 120-B IPC at Police Station, Mahilpur, District Hoshiarpur.

The petitioner was a part of marriage bureau who lured the complainant to a place in order to fix marriage of a girl with him and there , after serving him tea she was joined by four other persons who beat him up and clicked his photographs in objectionable position with a lady. A person representing himself to be from a news channel threatened to broadcast the clicked pictures.

Broadly on these allegations the petitioner prays false implication and indulgence under Section 438 Cr.P.C The FIR runs into intricate details of the aforesaid plot.

On perusal of the FIR and the prayer made by the petitioner, I

am of the view that the allegations set out are too serious to accept the plea of false implication straightway. It would be a matter of intense investigation where all persons involved would have to be brought to book and in the considered view of this Court the provisions of Section 438 Cr.P.C in such like instances cannot be exercised to grant an equitable relief to the petitioner and hence the instant petition deserves dismissal.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is willing to submit herself to the law.

In case the petitioner surrenders herself to law and makes a prayer for regular bail, the same shall be considered appropriately by the Court of competent jurisdiction and dispose of the same as expeditiously as possible but not later than three days from the date of making of such an application.
