Copy of the statement of complainant Harpal Singh has been received.

Report dated 18.05.2015 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Tarn Taran has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Harpal Singh and others namely Nirmal Singh and Ram Singh, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that parties belong to the same very village together with the fact that this compromise will go a long way in resolving the personal dispute and in bringing about peace and harmony for betterment of their future life and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.104 dated 19.07.2011 registered at Police Station Sadar Tarn Taran under Sections 307/34 IPC and sections 25/27/54/59 of Arms Act and all consequences arising out of the said FIR are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
