Learned counsel for the petitioner states that respondent No.4 was married with the petitioner and without seeking divorce from the petitioner, respondents No.4 and 5 illegally got married and filed **CRM-M No.44574 of 2014** without disclosing the factum of earlier marriage.

Petitioner prays for issuance of directions to respondents No.1 to 3 for taking appropriate action in accordance with law. FIR No.009 dated 09.01.2015 has already been registered under Sections 203, 363, 365, 366, 368, 449, 497, 198, 120-B, 34 IPC, P.S. Badhra.

Notice of motion.

At this stage, Mr. Ripu Daman, A.A.G., Haryana accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3. Let three copies of the petition be supplied to him by learned counsel for the petitioner during the course of day.

In view of nature of order which this Court proposes to pass, there is no necessity of filing reply.

This petition is disposed of with direction to respondents No.2 and 3 to assess the circumstances independently without being influenced by order dated 31.12.2014 passed in **CRM-M No.44574 of 2014.**

Even in the aforesaid order no particular direction has been issued except to direct the respondent No.2 to consider representation of respondent No.4.

In view of aforesaid facts and circumstances respondents No.2 and 3 would be obligated to adopt necessary mechanism to cull out the fact and take all remedial steps, if required under law.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
