The instant miscellaneous application has been filed for placing on record copy of photocopies of testimony of PW1, PW2 and PW3 recorded by the trial court in First Information Report No.124 dated 02.08.2014 as Annexure P3 to P5. Application is allowed and the documents are taken on record, subject to all just exceptions.

The present petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (in short, "Cr.P.C.") for grant of concession of regular bail to the petitioner in case bearing First Information Report No.124 dated 02.08.2014 under Section 324/34 of the Indian Penal Code (in short, "I.P.C."), registered at Police Station City-1, Abohar, District Fazilka, to which sections 307 and 354 I.P.C. were added lateron.

The submissions made by learned counsel representing the petitioner and learned counsel representing the State of Punjab have been considered.

The complainant as well as other material witnesses have already been examined. Photocopies of the statements of witnesses placed on record by learned counsel for the petitioner indicate that the petitioner had not been identified by the witnesses examined. The petitioner is in custody since 12.08.2014. Some witnesses are yet to be examined and the trial of the case is likely to take some more time. In view of aforesaid facts, there appears no plausible ground to detain the petitioner further in custody. Accordingly, he is admitted to bail, subject to his furnishing bail/ surety bonds, to the satisfaction of Area Magistrate/Trial Court, Fazilka.
