ANITA CHAUDHRY, J.

The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No. 199 dated 31.07.2014, registered at Police Station Samana, District Patiala, under Sections 148, 302, 307, 323, 324, 325, 326, 341 and 506 read with Section 149 IPC.

The complainant side has put in appearance and have filed their memo of appearance.

Heard.

Counsel for the petitioner contends that the only role attributed to the petitioner is that he was armed with a *soti* and had inflicted injury on the right arm of the complainant. He further urges that the investigation stage is over and challan has been filed and charge has been framed and the case is fixed for prosecution evidence. It was urged that the petitioner is in custody since 18.08.2014 and the trial is taking time and may be allowed bail.

On query, learned State counsel admits that all the accused have

been arrested and the case is fixed for prosecution evidence.

Learned counsel appearing for the complainant has opposed the bail application and has urged that the injury inflicted by the petitioner had resulted in a fracture in the right arm.

A perusal of the record shows that there is a cross case registered against the complainant side as well. The role attributed to the petitioner is that he had caused injury on the right arm of the complainant. Investigation stage is over. The petitioner is in custody for over six months. The trial would take time to complete.

Without commenting on the merits of the case and considering the role played by the him, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing adequate bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
