Vide this common order, I intend to dispose of two
petitions bearing **CRM No. M-729 of 2015** titled as, "**Baldev
Singh Dodhi vs. State of Punjab**" and **CRM No. M-731 of**

2015 titled as, "***Gurjit Singh @ Gogga vs. State of Punjab***"

as the same have arisen out of the same FIR.

Both the petitioners have applied for grant of regular bail in FIR No. 142 dated 02.09.2014 under Sections 307/ 341/ 148/149 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25/27 of the Arms Act registered at Police Station Cantt. Ferozepur, District Ferozepur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner(s) has submitted that co-accused Rajinder Singh @ Raj Singh has been allowed the concession of regular bail vide order dated 05.12.2014 passed in CRM No. M-40831 of 2014 on the ground that there is no attribution to him. He has further submitted that there is no attribution to both the present petitioners also.

Baldev Singh Dodhi is stated to be in custody since 25.10.2014 whereas Gurjit Singh @ Gogga is stated to be in custody since 08.12.2014. He has further submitted that it is a case of cross-version.

The said factual position has not been disputed by the learned State counsel, as well as, learned counsel for the complainant.

So, without commenting on the merits of the case, both the petitions stand accepted. Both the petitioners namely Baldev Singh Dodhi s/o Balwant Singh and Gurjit Singh @ Gogga s/o Joginder Singh are ordered to be released on bail on their furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court.

Both the petitions stand disposed of accordingly.
