INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has preferred this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C., seeking regular bail in case FIR No.05 dated 04.01.2014 registered at Police Station City Rohtak, District Rohtak, under Sections 307, 452, 328, 34 IPC and Section 3 (2)(5) of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned State counsel has appeared and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the FIR has been registered on the statement of Santosh. The allegation against the petitioner is that he alongwith main accused Vikas inflicted injuries on the neck of the son of complainant, whose name is also Vikas. At the time of arguments, learned counsel for the petitioner placed reliance on the

opinion of the doctor (Annexure P-2) vide which both the injuries have been declared simple in nature. The petitioner is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes nor anything is to be recovered from him as he is in custody since 10.01.2014. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the disposal of the case.

Therefore, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case and without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merit of the case, the present petition is accepted and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
