MAHESH GROVER, J.

After arguing at length, learned counsel for the petitioner prays for permission to withdraw the instant petition with liberty to approach the learned trial court and seek discharge from the proceedings in view of the fact that the petitioner is statedly not a signatory to the cheque.

The petition is disposed of as withdrawn with liberty to the petitioner to approach the learned trial court. In case the petitioner makes an application for exemption of personal appearance, the same shall be considered and decided in accordance with law. If the court comes to the conclusion that petitioner deserves the concession of exemption from personal exemption, he may be permitted to do so subject to the filing of an affidavit with the following conditions and any other condition which the court may deem fit to be imposed upon the petitioner

in the given set of circumstances :-

- i) Undertakes to appear before the trial court as and when so directed.
- ii) Undertakes that he would have no objection if the evidence is recorded in his absence.
- iii) Undertakes not to raise any dispute as to identity.
