The instant petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case F.I.R. No.72 dated 11.8.2012 under Sections 21, 22, 25, 29, 62-A, 68-A of the N.D.P.S Act, registered at Police Station, Khalchian, District Amritsar.

The alleged recovery from the petitioner is of 1 kg intoxicant powder which was found to be carrying Diphenoxylate. As such, this Court is not inclined to grant to the petitioner the benefit of regular bail.

Be that as it may, in the previous application filed by the petitioner seeking the same very relief, petition had been disposed of with a direction to the Trial Court to expedite the trial by giving short adjournments. Such order was passed on 11.4.2014 in CRM No. M-11574 of 2014.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Sikander Lal would apprise the Court that out of seven prosecution witnesses five have been examined till date and the matter is now fixed for 31.3.2015. Court has further been informed that even the I.O has not been examined till date.

As such, while declining the prayer and dismissing the instant petition as not pressed, directions are issued to the Trial Court to conclude the trial proceedings expeditiously and in any case within a period of four months from today.
