Petitioner seeks direction to the learned trial court for concluding the trial at an early date by invoking the inherent jurisdiction of this Court under Section 482 Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that trial is pending for more than seven years. She further submits that out of 26 witnesses, only one PW has been examined so far and the case has now been listed for 1.4.2015. She refers to different zimni orders passed by the learned trial court to show that matter is being delayed without any justified reasons.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, present petition is

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disposed with a direction to the learned trial court to ensure early conclusion of the trial, as the same is going on for the last more than seven years. The learned trial court shall make an endeavour to conclude the trial at an early date, preferably within six months.
