This order shall dispose of aforesaid two petitions i.e
CRM No. M-8769 of 2015, filed by Avtar Singh and others and
CRM No. M-8795 of 2015, filed by Avtar Singh and others.

2. CRM No. M-8769 of 2015, has been filed under Section

482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.71 dated 14.04.2014, under Sections 323, 379, 427, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Samana, District Patiala (Annexure P-1) along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 16.07.2014 (Annexure P-2).

3. CRM No.M-8795 of 2015 has also been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of DDR No.10, dated 14.04.2014, under Sections 323, 379, 427, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Sadar Samana, District Patiala in FIR No.71 dated 14.04.2014, under Sections 323, 379, 427, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Samana, District Patiala and all subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 16.07.2014 (Annexure P-2).

4. Report of Id. Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that compromise appears to have been effected voluntarily, without any pressure and with free will or coercion and appears to be genuine. Even otherwise, matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

5. In view of the above I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

6. Consequently, both these petitions stand allowed and FIR No.71 dated 14.04.2014, under Sections 323, 379, 427, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Samana, District Patiala as

also DDR No.10, dated 14.04.2014, in FIR No. 71, dated 14.04.2014, under Sections 323, 379, 427, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Samana, District Patiala and all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, are quashed qua petitioner(s).
