AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a petition for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.171 dated 18.11.2014 registered under Section 7 of Essential Commodities Act and Section 9-B of Explosive Act at Police Station Dhariwal, District Gurdaspur.

On 10.04.2015 the following order was passed:-

“List on 07.05.2015.

To be listed alongwith CRM-M-44496 of 2014.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to appear before the Investigating/Arresting Officer within one week from today and join the investigation. In the event of arrest of petitioner, she be admitted to interim bail by the Investigating/Arresting Officer to his satisfaction. She shall join the investigation as and when called upon by the

*Investigating/Arresting Officer and cooperate in the investigation.
She would also abide by all the conditions as envisaged by
Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”*

Learned Assistant Advocate General, on instructions from ASI Harjit Singh states that the report of the District Food & Supply Controller has been filed as per which the godown has been sealed and all the cylinders have been confiscated. He has accepted the fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation and no longer required for custodial interrogation.

In these circumstances, I do not deem it appropriate to deny anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Resultantly, the petition is allowed. The interim order dated 10.04.2015 is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
