This is second bail petition.

As per allegations of the prosecution, the petitioner has duped five persons for a sum of ₹5.60 lacs each on the pretext of sending them abroad.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in the petition, there are allegations that the petitioner took money for sending five person to Cyprus whereas the investigation says that it was for sending them to Canada. He has further submitted that petitioner is in custody for the last seven months. So, petitioner is entitled to concession of regular bail.

The prayer has been opposed by the learned State counsel.

According the allegations, the petitioner has duped five persons for a sum of ₹5.60 lacs each and has given fake tickets.

So, no ground for grant of regular bail is made out.

When this court is not inclined to accept the prayer, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
