RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Petitioner seeks pre-arrest bail in FIR No.16 dated 21.2.2015 registered under Sections 498-A/406/323 IPC at Police Station City Sardulgarh, District Mansa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the incident did not take place in the manner it has been alleged in the FIR. He further submits that petitioner neither gave any beatings to his wife (deceased) nor he ever harassed her for bringing less dowry. He also submits that petitioner is ready to cooperate with the investigating agency.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, present one has not been found to be a fit case for anticipatory bail. It is so said because allegations against the petitioner are direct and specific. He, being the husband, is the main accused. The custodial interrogation of the petitioner will be the compulsive necessity of the investigating agency to carry out an effective investigation. No case for anticipatory bail is made out.
