FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 24.07.2015 of learned Additional Civil Judge (Sr. Divn.)-cum-SDJM, Malout has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Balwinder Kumar Chhabra and the accused persons namely Ashu Chalana @ Ashwani Chalana and Pawan Kumar @ Parvinder Kumar, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that parties belong to the same very area and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of heinous nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.74 dated 25.05.2014 registered at Police Station City Malout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib under Sections 324/34 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
