Instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for issuance of direction to respondents no.1 to 3 for conducting the investigation effectively in accordance with law in a case FIR No.131 dated 01.12.2014, registered at Police Station Sujampur, District Pathankot, under Sections 324/323/34 of the Indian Penal Code with further direction to respondents no.1 and 2 to hand over the investigation to a senior police officer preferably an IPS officer outside District Pathankot.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the record.

Earlier the petitioner filed CRM-M-1756-2015 which was

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disposed of with a direction to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Pathankot, to supervise the investigation of the case to ensure fair enquiry. It was also observed that if the petitioner felt aggrieved even thereafter, he could approach this Court.

The petitioner is still aggrieved against the alleged investigation. The petitioner claims that he has approached the Senior Superintendent of Police, Pathankot and moved representation dated 26.01.2015 (Annexure P-4), but no action is being taken. The petitioner has again approached the Senior Superintendent of Police, Pathankot on 26.01.2015 i.e. after five days of order passed in CRM-M-1756-2015.

This shows that even breathing time has not been given to the investigation to take appropriate steps.

In such circumstances, the present petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to approach the concerned Inspector General of Police or other higher authorities, who will look into the grievance of the petitioner and if the petitioner feels that his grievance has not been met with satisfactorily, he would be at liberty to approach this Court again.
