ANITA CHAUDHRY, J.

The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No. 197 dated 18.06.2009 registered at Police Station Sampla, District Rohtak, under Sections 148, 149, 302, 307, 120-B, 212, 404 IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act.

The petitioner is facing trial in a case registered under Sections 302 and 307 IPC along with several other accused. The police had received information that Rakesh, Sunil and Pappu had sustained bullet injuries at the hands of unknown person. The information was supplied by Arjun, the Sarpanch of the village.

The prosecution has closed its evidence and the case is fixed for recording the statement of the accused. In all 18 accused are facing trial.

Heard.

Counsel for the petitioner prays that the petitioner is in

custody since September, 2009 and the trial is not concluding and bail should be allowed. He further contends that Azrudin was allowed bail on 13.02.2015 and he seeks parity and also urges that Titto, Rajesh and Rakesh the other accused were released on bail in 2011.

The State has opposed the prayer and states that Titto had been allowed bail as the allegations against him were only under Section 212 IPC and as regards Rajesh, allegations were that he was not actually involved and was accused of conspiracy alone. He contends that the status of the case was not before the Court when bail application of Azruddin was decided and now trial has concluded and statements of accused have been recorded and only arguments have to be addressed.

Since the prosecution has already closed its evidence, the trial will be concluded very shortly. No ground for bail is made out. Petition is dismissed.
