This judgment shall dispose of two Criminal Revisions Petitions No.151 and 152 of 2015 as both are between the same parties.

Three demand drafts towards the payment of the principal amount made by the petitioner have been handed over to Col. V.S. Dhillon-respondent No.2 in the Court. Photostat copies thereof are retained on the files of this Court as Mark-A,

B and C.

Learned counsel for the petitioner undertakes to make the remaining payment of Rs.1,10,000/- in terms of the compromise dated 11.03.2014.

As per the custody certificates placed on record, the petitioner has undergone 12 days sentence in both the cases.

Learned counsel for the respondent No.2 accepts the offer made by the learned counsel for the petitioner and states that he has no objection if the present petitions are allowed on the basis of compromise.

In these circumstances, the present Criminal Revision Petitions No.151 and 152 are allowed. The judgment of conviction and sentence passed by both the Courts below are set aside on the basis of compromise. The remaining payment of Rs.1,10,000/- shall be made within three months from today by way of demand draft. In addition to this the petitioner shall comply with the directions in ***Damodar S. Prabhu Vs. Sayed Babalal 2010 (3) Recent Apex Judgments 180.***

It is made clear that in case the remaining amount is not paid within the stipulated period, the present revision petitions shall be deemed to be dismissed without notice and the entire amount shall remain forfeited and the petitioner has to

undergo the remaining part of the sentence.

Registry is directed to issue his release warrants in
both the cases.
