AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a revision against the concurrent conviction of the petitioner by the Courts below under Sections 467 and 120-B IPC.

Custody certificate by way of affidavit of A.R.Bishnoi, Superintendent, Central Jail, Ambala has been filed and the same is taken on record. Copy supplied to the counsel opposite.

On 21.10.2015 the following contention was noticed :-

“Learned counsel has argued that the petitioner has undergone 15 months out of the total sentence of 2 years and in the cases of peripheral accused and one co-convict who was the beneficiary the sentence has been reduced to that they have already undergone. He has further argued that he would not press this petition on merits but prays for some reduction in the sentence.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Ms. Tanushree Gupta, Deputy Advocate General, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent.

Learned counsel for the petitioner undertakes to supply a copy of the petition to the learned DAG during the course of the day. As requested by the learned counsel for the petitioner, the case is directed to be listed alongwith CRR-3991-2015 on 31.10.2015.”

As far as the claim for parity is concerned the learned Deputy Advocate General has fairly accepted that parity should also be granted to the petitioner. Consequently even while dismissing his revision his sentence is reduced to that which he has already undergone.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
