JITENDRA CHAUHAN, J. (Oral)

This Civil Writ Petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to the respondents to release all the retiral benefits with interest from the date of retirement till realization of amount.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that entire retiral benefits have been released in favour of the petitioner. However, he further submits that the petitioner was compulsory retired in the year 2006 whereas payment was made on various dates.

Considering the fact that the main relief has already been granted, the petitioner is free to make representation to the concerned authority with regard to the interest on delayed payment.

Accordingly, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents that in case, the petitioner file a representation with regard to payment of interest on delayed payment, within 45 days from today, the competent authority shall decide the same, in terms of **A. J. Randhawa Vs. State of Punjab** 1998 (1) SCT 343 Full Bench Punjab and Haryana High Court and **The Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary to Govt. Haryana, Irrigation Department, Civil Secretariat, Chandigarh and others Vs. Hasan Singh Kanwar, SDO, LPA No.915 of 2009**, and if the authorities come to the conclusion that the relief prayed for, is made out in favour of the petitioner, the consequential relief be released within six weeks, from the receipt of such representation.
