Learned counsel appearing for the 2nd respondent informs the Court that Pension Payment Order as per Rule 54 (7) (b) Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972 has been issued and the interest at the rate of 7 % thereupon as ordered by this Court has also been given credit to the account of the writ petitioner.

Learned counsel for the writ petitioner also admits the fact that the Pension Payment Order has been received and the same would be deposited with the bank and the proceeds thereof will be released by the Bank after necessary instructions have been received from the Head Office of the concerned Bank. He also admits that the interest at the rate of 7 % on the family pension, ordered by this Court, was also given credit to the

account of the writ petitioner. So, the writ petition, in our view, has become infructuous.

Recording the above submissions, the writ petition stands disposed of as having become infructuous.
