RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Nirmal Singh, Police Station Valtola, District Tarn Taran, submits that alleged detainee was never detained by the police nor he was wanted in any case. She also refers to the report of the Warrant Officer wherein it is recorded that the alleged detainee-Gurjit Singh himself stated that he was neither brought to the police station by any police official nor he had been confined. She submits that once the alleged detainee has been released, present petition does not survive and the same may be disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
