The instant complaint was received by post and the same has been treated as Criminal Writ Petition.

In the complaint, the complainant, namely, Rajwant Kaur wife of Anokh Singh, resident of Village Vairawal Bawian, Patti Darapur, Tehsil Khadur Sahib, Distt. Tarn Taran, has complained about disappearance of her husband Anokh Singh.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, learned State counsel has filed reply.

Learned State counsel submits that in fact the petitioner has concealed the material facts of this Court and rather made the averments which are totally misleading. The C.I.A. Staff. Tarn Taran has enquired the matter and found that FIR No. 26, dated 21.02.2015, under Sections 22/61/85 of N.D.P.S. Act, 25/54/59 of Arms Act, Police Station, Sarhali, District-Tarn Taran, were registered against Anokh Singh (husband of the petitioner). Furthermore, on the basis of recovery, 300 grams intoxicant powder, 12 bore pistol and two live cartridges of same bore, were recovered from the accused-Anokh Singh. The accused Anokh

Singh son of Sadhu Singh (husband of the petitioner) was arrested at the spot on 21.02.2015 and now he is in judicial custody.

The said accused-Anokh Singh is active member of the gang of drug smuggler and the petitioner has filed this writ petition with mala fide intention in order to continue the illegal profession of smuggling of Heroin/Intoxicant.

Learned State counsel has also drawn attention of this Court other cases have also been registered against accused-Anokh Singh(husband of the petitioner), which are as follows:-

- (i) FIR No. 117/1997, dated 07.07.1997, u/s 25/54/59 Arms Act, P.S. Verowal, District-Tarn Taran.
- (ii) FIR No. 112/1997, dated 05.07.1997, u/s 379/411 IPC , P.S. Verowal, District-Tarn Taran.
- (iii) FIR No. 174/1999, dated 30.10.1999, u/s 302/392 IPC, P.S. Sultanwind, Amritsar.
- (iv) FIR No. 176/1999, dated 03.11.1999, u/s 25/54/59 Arms Act, P.S. Verowal, District-Tarn Taran.
- (v) FIR No. 219/2004, dated 20.12.2004, u/s 223/224, P.S. City, Tarn Taran.
- (vi) FIR No. 171/2014, dated 06.07.2014, u/s 379/411 IPC, P.S. Beas.

In view of the above, the present complaint is totally perverse and misleading, as the husband of the petitioner, namely Anokh Singh is involved FIR No. 26, dated 21.02.2015, under Sections 22/61/85 of N.D.P.S. Act and 25/54/59 of the Arms Act, Police Station, Sarhali, District-Tarn Taran, rather other six criminal cases, as indicated above, the present petition/complaint is dismissed.
