Prayer in this petition is for release of the petitioner on emergency parole on the ground that he is suffering from various serious ailments and is getting treatment from PGI.

Learned State counsel had filed reply and submits that the petitioner was required to surrender before the jail authorities on 25.02.2015, but he did not surrender himself in the jail and rather he had intentionally admitted in Civil Hospital S.A.S. Nagar (Mohali) on 24.02.2015 from where he was discharged on 27.02.2015.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the petitioner has drawn attention of this Court towards medical record of the petitioner, whereby, Civil Hospital, Mohali, has referred the petitioner to PGI, Chandigarh, for further management.

Considering the serious ailments of the petitioner, the attending doctor of Department of Orthopedics, PGI, Chandigarh,

has further referred the petitioner to the Department of pulmonary medicines for proper treatment and opinion.

Keeping in view of the medical record of the petitioner, who is about 75 years of age, I dispose of the present petition with a direction to the respondent-authority to consider the case of the petitioner for grant of 6 weeks' parole, in accordance with law.
