An application dated 21.4.2015 of Ramesh Kaur was received by post and was treated as a Criminal Writ Petition (Habeas Corpus) and as such, taken up on the judicial side of this Court.

Upon a notice having been issued, a response has been filed by way of affidavit of the Dy.S.P. (D), Ferozepur on behalf of State of Punjab.

The allegations and assertions contained in the application dated 21.4.2015 submitted by Ramesh Kaur with regard to her sons Jagmeet Singh and Baljeet Singh having been confined in illegal custody, have been controverted in the light of the following terms:-

“2. The family of the petitioner has a criminal history. A case FIR No.54 dated 6.4.2011 under sections 489-A, 489-B and 489-C at P.S. Sadar Fazilka was registered against son and husband of the petitioner namely Jagmeet Singh @ Judge and Puran Singh @ Makhan for recovery of 2,57,500/- Indian fake currency. Against Jagmeet Singh who is son of the petitioner a case FIR No.18 dated 14.2.2014 under section 21/61/85 NDPS Act stands registered at P.S. Sadar Moga for recovery of one kilogram heroin.

A case FIR No.24 dated 12.1.2012 under sections 489-A, 489-B, 489-C IPC has also been registered against

Puran Singh husband of the petitioner at police station Sadar Ferozepur for recovery of Indian fake currency of Rs.2,30,000/-.

Puran Singh husband of the petitioner was also booked in case FIR No.3 dated 5.2.2012 under sections 21/25/29 of the NDPS Act, P.S. Kulgari for the recovery of 5 kilograms heroin besides two SIMs of Pakistan.

3. That on 25.4.2015 Jagmeet Singh son of the petitioner was apprehended by the police and on his search 260 grams of intoxicated powder was recovered and against him FIR No.98 dated 25.4.2015 under sections 22/61/85 of the NDPS Act has been registered at police station Sadar Ferozepur. On 16.4.2015 Jagmeet Singh and Baljeet Singh sons of the petitioner were not taken by the police nor they were wanted by the police on that day.”

In the light of such categorical stand taken on behalf of the State,
no further directions are required to be passed in the matter.

Petition, accordingly, is disposed of.
