In this writ petition, the petitioner has prayed for following
relief:

“Issuance of a writ, order or any direction, especially a writ in the nature of mandamus, direction be issued to take the final decision on the Legal Notice dated 21.12.2013 (Annexure P-10) served to respondents with the request for revising his pay under the revised pay rules 1.1.1986 and revised the pension and pensionary benefits, thereafter, also revise his pension under the Rules, 2009 and released all the benefits i.e. arrear of pay, arrear of revised pension and along with consequential benefits with interest @ 12 % per annum on delayed payments.”

The State has filed reply in which they have stated that claim of the petitioner has been settled vide communication dated 11.09.2014 (Annexure R-1/3) and 07.10.2014 (Annexure R-1/4) and

arrears of revised payments to the tune of Rs. 19,018/- has been deposited in the concerned bank account of the petitioner by the Treasury Office on 07.10.2014.

In view of these settlement of the retiral benefits, the petition do not survive for consideration. However, if the petitioner is still aggrieved, liberty is reserved to him to approach the respondents by way of representation for enhanced retiral benefits. The same shall be considered by the respondents within a period of **three months** from the date of receipt of representation.

The writ petition is, accordingly, disposed of in above terms.
