Learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, fairly states that though during the pendency of the writ petition, principal amount sought by the petitioners have been paid to them but with no interest.

Learned counsel for the respondents also could not dispute the correctness of the statement made by the learned counsel for the petitioners.

In view of the above, present writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to approach the competent authority, by moving an appropriate representation within a period of four weeks from today. If the petitioners approach the competent authority within a period of four weeks from today, by moving an appropriate representation claiming interest on the delayed payment of their dues, the same shall be duly considered and decided by the competent authority at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioners.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
