Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondent nos. 1 to 4 to decide the objections dated 07.11.2014 (Annexures P-3/T and P-4/T) filed by the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that direction may be issued to the respondents-authorities to decide the objections (Annexures P-3/T and P-4/T) filed by the petitioners. Learned counsel further submits that instant writ petition may also be treated as a representation in addition to Annexures P-3/T and P-4/T.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioners and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the

case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents authorities to consider the writ petition as representation along with the Annexures P-3/T and P-4/T and pass an appropriate order thereon in accordance with law. Needful shall be done preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
