1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment?

AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

By this petition the petitioner has challenged the orders dated 10.01.2012 and 14.02.2012 whereby he was terminated from service.

The petitioner joined as a Constable in the ITBP Force on 01.01.2011. After completion of training he was granted one month leave from 20.09.2011 to 20.10.2011. As per the petition, on 21.10.2011 he sent an application for extension of leave 'for a few days' and the same was alleged to be allowed. It is not mentioned that as to when the petitioner rejoined the Unit after this extended period of leave but within a few days thereafter, on 08.11.2011 the petitioner again went missing. He did not

move any application for any leave and did not join back his duty. Ultimately he was removed from service by order dated 14.02.2012 (Annexure P-4). The petitioner did not file any appeal but he moved an application for reinstatement after 9 months on 20.11.2012. When it did not elicit any reply he moved a representation to the respondent No.1 after a further period of more than 1 year on 27.12.2013. Thereafter he sent reminders and has now approached this Court by way of present writ petition.

I find that this Court would have no jurisdiction to go into the matter. The petitioner was serving at Bhuvneshwar, Orissa and the impugned orders were passed there.

Petition is dismissed being not maintainable.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending civil miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
