What has been assailed in the matter in hand is the order of dismissal of late husband of the petitioner, namely, Gurmeet Singh on 16.08.2006 (Annexure P1). Even an appeal against the said order was dismissed on 26.07.2010 (Annexure P5). A period of five years had gone by. Ex facie, the petition suffers from gross, inordinate and unexplained delay. It is maintained in paragraph 7 of the petition that the petitioner in fact received the copy of the order dated 26.07.2010 (Annexure P5) only in the first week of November, 2013, when she personally visited the office of respondent No.3. Learned Assistant Advocate General, Punjab was asked to verify whether the copy of the order dated 26.07.2010 (Annexure P5) was indeed served upon the petitioner and if so when. The matter was passed over. In the second round,

learned State counsel has produced the relevant record, which has been examined by the learned counsel for the petitioner and is taken on record. Ex facie, the order dated 26.07.2010 (Annexure P5) was duly served upon the petitioner. Report of service dated 16.08.2010, bears her signatures. Learned counsel for the petitioner concedes this position. That being so, he prays that he be permitted to withdraw the instant petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
