In the wake of an order, I intend to pass, no formal written statement is required to be filed by the State at this stage.

The reason that has been assigned by the department in support of the order rejecting the claim of the petitioner for appointment on compassionate/priority basis reads as thus:

“2. The Competent Authority has taken a decision rejecting thereby the case cited above pertaining to Candidate Parminder Singh Son of Late SI

Gurcharan Singh No.346/FR for his appointment on priority base in Punjab Police as a Constable because the proposal is not covered under the instructions.”

Ex facie, the order being assailed is bereft of any reason as nothing is indicated as to how the claim of the petitioner is not covered under the relevant instructions of the Government.

Learned State counsel submits that as the order is judicially perverse, the same be set aside. And a direction be issued to the respondents to consider the claim of the petitioner afresh and pass a speaking order.

That being so, the order dated 18.09.2014 (Annexure P9) is set aside. Respondents are directed to consider the claim of the petitioner afresh and pass appropriate orders, strictly in accordance with the law, within a period of two months from the receipt of certified copy of this order. Needless to assert, a comprehensive order shall be passed, assigning reasons in support of the decision arrived at.
