The petitioner has prayed for a writ in the nature of mandamus seeking a direction to respondent Nos. 1 to 4 to take action against respondent Nos. 5 and 6 who had been recruited in the army on the basis of forged documents.

On 9.10.2012, the petitioner was asked as to whether he is willing to deposit a sum of ₹ 50,000/- before the Registrar of this Court to show his bona fide. On the adjourned date, counsel for the petitioner submitted that his client is willing to deposit a sum of ₹ 50,000/- before the Registrar of this Court to establish his bona fide. He also brought a Bank Draft for a sum of ₹ 50,000/- dated 07.01.2013 drawn on the Oriental Bank of Commerce in favour of the Registrar of this Court.

Learned State counsel has submitted that an FIR No. 48 dated 17.03.2005, under Section 468 IPC, has already been registered at Police Station Chappar, District Yamuna Nagar against respondent Nos. 5 and 6.

Therefore, this petition has become infructuous as the mandamus sought by the petitioner has been granted.

Counsel for the petitioner does not want to pursue this case any further except for the request that an amount of ₹ 50,000/- deposited by him to show his bona fide may be returned to him.

After considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this petition is disposed of as having become infructuous and the Registrar of this Court is directed to return ₹ 50,000/-deposited by the petitioner in terms of the orders passed by this Court on 15.01.2013, after verifying the identity of the petitioner. Needless to say that once the FIR is registered, the investigating officer shall investigate the matter expeditiously.
