1.) The petitioners are aggrieved by the final publication of the *Wardbandi* of village Dulyani, Tehsil Pundri, District Kaithal. Their grievance is that the objections submitted by them pointing out discrepancies in the *Gram Wardbandi* have not been taken into account while finalizing the same.

2.) The respondents have filed their written statement *inter*

alia pointing out that in terms of the office circular dated 20.2.2015 issued by Deputy Commissioner, Kaithal, the objections were required to be submitted between 11.3.2015 to 13.3.2015 and after considering those objections, the final *Wardbandi* was published on 31.3.2015. It has further been explained that process of *Wardbandi* was given wide publicity by way of news in the local newspapers, news on television channel and local news channels besides *Munadi* conducted by the Chowkidar of the village. The petitioners, however, chose to submit their objections in May, 2015 i.e. much after the publication of final *Wardbandi* on 31.3.2015.

3.) In the light of the facts explained by the respondents regarding petitioners' failure to submit the objections on time, we are of the considered view that no interference in the final *Wardbandi* at this stage is called for.
