Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of the respondent authorities, the petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking a writ in the nature of Certiorari as well as writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondent authorities to offer appointment to the petitioner.

On the last date of hearing, following order was passed in the presence of learned counsel for both the parties:-

“In view of the conflicting medical reports available on record vide Annexures P5 and P6, it seems appropriate that, to resolve the controversy the matter be referred to the Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh to constitute a Board of Doctors to medically examine the petitioner and submit the medical report before this Court.

In view of the above, Director PGIMER, Chandigarh, is directed to constitute a medical Board of Doctors so as to carry out medical examination of the petitioner, whether he suffers any defect in vision

or not, so that petitioner can be directed to be re-considered for appointment in question. Let the Director PGIMER, Chandigarh, submit his medical report before the next date of hearing. Office is directed to send a copy of this order along with a copy of the writ petition to the Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh, for compliance thereof.

In compliance of the above said order passed by this Court, report of the Medical Board dated 21.01.2015 constituted by the Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh has been received.

In view of the above, present writ petition is disposed of with direction to the competent authority, whosoever it might be out of the respondents, to re-consider the matter keeping in view the medical report dated 21.01.2015 furnished by the Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh so as to offer appointment to the petitioner at an early date and in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Disposed of accordingly.
