The petitioners have filed the present writ petition seeking quashing of the order dated 18.01.2011 (**P-3**), passed by the Revisional Authority/ Government, whereby the revision filed by respondent Nos.4 and 5 under Section 16 of the Punjab Land Revenue Act, 1887 against the order dated 03.10.2005 (**P-2**), passed by Commissioner (Appeals), Patiala/respondent No.2 was accepted and the appellate order (**P-2**) sanctioning mutation in favour of the petitioners, has been set aside.

The dispute is relating to the correctness of Mutation No.1867 dated 11.08.1997 of Village Kalewal Hadbust 112, Tehsil Kharar, District Mohali, sanctioned by the Assistant Collector Gr.-II, Kharar in favour of the predecessor-in-interest of the petitioners on the basis of an order passed by the Consolidation Officer on 31.07.1959.

Since the parties are related to each other, this Court had referred them before the Mediation & Conciliation Centre of this Court.

As per report, the parties have arrived at a written agreement dated 04.02.2015, which is available at **Flag 'B'**. As per the settlement, the relevant Paras 6 and 7 read as under:-

- “ 6. The following settlement has been arrived at between the parties hereto:
- a) That the parties have agreed to mutation No.1867 of village Kalewal, Hadbast No.112, Tehsil Kharar, District Mohali sanctioned by the Consolidation Officer on 11.08.1997 which was duly entered as per the order passed by the Consolidation Officer and has been upheld by Commissioner, Patiala Division, Patiala vide order dated 3.10.2005. And as a consequence thereof, the petitioners shall withdraw the present C.W.P. No.24497 of 2011.
7. By signing this Agreement the parties hereto state that they have no further claims or demands against each other with respect to the dispute/ claim/ proceedings filed by them against each other. All the disputes and differences with regard to the present matter have been amicably settled by the parties hereto through the process of Mediation and shall not institute any other case against each other with reference to the present claim. ”

At the time of hearing, Randhir Singh (petitioner No.2) and son of petitioner No.1 states that he wishes to withdraw the present writ petition in view of the terms of the aforesaid conditions of the agreement dated 04.02.2015.

Dismissed as withdrawn in view of the agreement dated 04.02.2015 (Flag 'B').
