The claim of the petitioners is that though their names were recommended for appointment, but under the garb of verification of experience certificates, they were not issued appointment letter. Show cause notices dated 21.6.2014 (Annexure P-4) were issued to the petitioners, the relevant extracts of which are extracted below:

The petitioners have already filed replies to the aforesaid show cause notices on 5.7.2014 and 7.7.2014, respectively. However, till date no final decision has been taken, though other candidates, in whose cases certain objections were raised, have been permitted to join.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioners, however, without opining on the merits of the controversy, the present petition is disposed of at this stage with a direction to respondent No. 2 to take a final decision on the show cause notices issued to the petitioners, to which they have already filed replies, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of copy of the order.
