The only grouse of the petitioners is that when the Draft Development Plans were notified in the Gazette dated 14.07.2014, which pertains to the area of outside Municipal Corporation Limit and on 18.07.2014, which pertains to the area within Municipal Limit, no proper publication was made. Therefore, some of the petitioners could not file objection to those Development Plans.

It is the case of the State that out of four petitioners, three have filed objections to the Draft Development Plans dated 18.07.2014 because their land falls within the limit of Municipal Committee.

No objection was filed against Draft Development Plan notified on 14.07.2014.

Be that as it may, learned counsel for respondents No.1 and 2 states that if the petitioners want to file objection to any of the Plans mentioned above, they may file the same within fifteen days and those objections will be considered before finalizing the same.

In view of the categorical stand taken by the aforesaid respondents, this writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to file the objections against Draft Development Plans within a period of fifteen days and the same shall be considered by the respondents before finalizing the said Plans. The respondents are further directed to make a publication in the newspaper to the effect that if anybody wants to file the objection to the aforesaid Draft Development Plans, they can also file the same within fifteen days from the date of publication, and respondents will consider the same before finalizing the said Plans.

Since the main writ petition is disposed of with the aforesaid liberty, at this stage, we do not deem it appropriate to implead the applicants as respondents.

Accordingly, both the applications are dismissed.
