Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states that although petitioner is seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus, yet because of inadvertence and bonafide reasons, he could not approach the respondent authorities by moving an appropriate representation before filing the present writ petition. He further submits that given an opportunity, petitioner shall approach the competent authority, i.e. respondent No.2 by moving an appropriate representation within a period of four weeks from today and respondent No.2 may be directed to consider and decide the same, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, including the issue of

limitation, if any, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, Chief Electrical Inspector, Electrical Inspector, Haryana-respondent No.2, is directed that if the petitioner approaches him by moving an appropriate representation within a period of four weeks from today, he shall consider and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioner.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
