Feeling aggrieved against the order dated 22.8.2014 (Annexure P-3) passed by Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa-respondent No.3, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari/mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner refers to an advertisement (Annexure P-2), whereby qualification and experience were prescribed for the post of Fireman. He also refers to a communication dated 21.8.2014 (Annexure P-5), issued by the Director, Urban Local Bodies Department, Haryana-respondent No.2 to respondent No.4 about the Fire Fighting Course imparted by D.R. Memorial Private ITI, Khairekan, District Sirsa, but in spite of the that fact respondents No. 3 and 4 did not take appropriate action to annul the illegal appointments issued on the basis of unrecognised certificates as well as experience. However, at this stage, learned counsel for

the petitioner submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case he is permitted to approach respondent No.3 by moving an appropriate representation within a period of three weeks from today and he may be directed to consider and decide the same, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Deputy Commissioner, Sirsa-respondent No.3, is directed that if the petitioner approaches him by moving an appropriate representation within a period of three weeks from today, he shall consider and decide the same, keeping in view the official communication dated 21.8.2014 (Annexure P-5), at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioner.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
