The claim of the petitioners in the present case is for quashing the phrase in the orders dated 25.7.2012 (Annexures P-2 and P-3) passed by the High Court, whereby the petitioners have been granted higher pay scale of ₹1200-2040 w.e.f. 1.5.1990.

Mr.I.D.Singla, learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that the respondents have granted the relief to the petitioners only from the date of the order passed in CWP No.5001 of 2001, which was decided on 25.7.2012, whereas it should have been from the date of filing of the writ petition.

Mr.Keshav Gupta, learned AAG, Haryana, appearing on behalf

of the State submits that in view of the stand taken in the written statement, the claim of the petitioners has been restricted upto 38 months preceding the date of filing the writ petition. However, due to inadvertence, the date of the filing of the writ petition has been mentioned as 31.1.2012. However, it should have been from the date of filing of the writ petition, which was filed in the year 2001.

In view of the stand taken by the respondents, the writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to consider the claim of the petitioners for grant of higher pay scale from the date of 38 months prior to the date of filing of the writ petition.

It is expected that the respondents shall rectify their mistake as indicated in the written statement and take the date of filing of the writ petition to be filed on 27.3.2001 and it is further directed that the respondents shall release the arrears to the petitioners restricted to 38 months prior to the filing of the writ petition and shall pay the same within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
