Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for quashing of impugned order (Annexure P/8) passed by respondent no.3 – District Food and Supplies Controller Officer, Ludhiana.

The case set up by the petitioner is that she is wife of Charanjit Singh and ration card was rightly prepared in the year 2010.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the record.

Firstly, the petitioner has claimed that she was wife of

petitioner allegedly got married with Charanjit Singh by way of Kareva marriage. The dispute is with regard to the issuance of two ration cards. One ration card was earlier existing mentioning name of Balwinder Kaur wife of Nirvair Singh from where the name of the petitioner was never deleted. Thereafter, the petitioner got another ration card by mentioning her name as Balwinder Kaur wife of Charanjit Singh. Not only this, in Annexure P/1, the petitioner has shown her name at column no.4 as Balwinder Kaur daughter of Charanjit Singh. From perusal of the record, it appears that one of the ration cards must have been procured fraudulently or by concealing the material fact. In this situation, the inquiry was held by District Controller, Food Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, Ludhiana and ultimately, the District Controller came to the conclusion that in violation of the Government instructions, petitioner got entered her name in two ration cards and has suggested that the action should be initiated against the petitioner.

In view of above, I do not find any illegality or perversity in the impugned order. Otherwise also, disputed facts are involved which cannot be appreciated in exercise of the writ jurisdiction.

Dismissed.
