MAHESH GROVER.J.

The petitioner impugns the order of his transfer on the ground that transfer of the incumbent intended to be posted against the post held by the petitioner would not indicate any administrative exigency. Further contends that the students are incensed with the transfer and that the order is mala fide as the petitioner had refused to submit to the demands of the management in pushing through the list of guest lecturers which appointments were based on nepotism.

On due consideration of the matter, I do not find any reason to interfere with the impugned order in the exercise of my jurisdiction under Article 226 of the Constitution of India. The petitioner has not impleaded anybody by name, if he is alleging

mala fides. Therefore, this plea cannot be accepted in the absence of complete particulars. Apart from that, the other contentions raised have no bearing on the issue at hand for the simple reason that the transfer is an administrative action, not to be interfered with by courts unless it is based on extraneous considerations.

No ground to interfere.

Dismissed.
